BIOGRAPHY OF ACARYA PRIYAVRATA SARMA AND HIS CONTRIBUTION TO AYURVEDA

Ācārya Priyavrata Śarmā (1st November, 1920 to 18th May, 2007)

ABSTRACT

Ācārya Priyavrata Śarmā is well known for his valuable contribution in the field of Āyurvēda. A prolific Writer, Orator, Teacher, Research scholar, Leader, Administrator and above all a good Human being stood as an emblem for Āyurvēda in the 20th century.

He was born on 1st November, 1920, in a small village named Mustafapur near Khagol in district Patna, Bihar in the family of traditional Vaidya. His father was Pandita Rāmāvatāra Miśra Vaidyabhūṣaṇa and mother was Śrimati Prēmadulāri Dēvi. He was highly qualified in Āyurvēda, Sanskrit and Hindi and held highest positions in Academic as well as in Administrative fields in Āyurvēda.

Ācārya Priyavrata Śarmā authored 35 books, edited 14 Ayurvedic manuscripts and 3 books and has about 500 scientific papers to his credit. He participated in several National and International conferences and was associated with several committees on Āyurvēda at National level. With profound admiration, Ācārya Priyavrata Śarmā's biographical information and his contribution to the Āyurvēda is portrayed in this article.

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Introduction

 $\bar{A}c\bar{a}rya$ Priyavrata Śarmā is well known for his valuable contributions in the field of $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$. A prolific Writer, Orator, Teacher, Research scholar, Leader, Administrator and above all a good Human being, he stood as an emblem for $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$ in the 20^{th} century.

Birth and Native Place

He was born on 1st November, 1920, in the family of traditional *Vaidya* in a small village named Mustafapur, near Khagol in the district Patna of Bihar state in India.^{3,4,5,6}

Family History

He was born to Paṇḍita Rāmāvatāra Miśra Vaidyabhūṣaṇa and ŚrImati Prēmadulārī Dēvī. His father Paṇḍita Rāmāvatāra Miśra Vaidyabhūṣaṇa was a famous Ayurvedic physician and founder of Bihār Prāntīya Vaidyasammēlana (Regional association of physicians of Bihar). He inherited the understanding and commitment with full dedication for upliftment of Āyurvēda from his father. His mother Śrīmati Prēmadulārī Dēvī was a pious and kind hearted woman. He was the fifth child after one elder brother and three sisters and followed by another younger sister. His elder brother Paṇḍita Satyavrata Śarmā (Sujana) was a famous poet and writer. Ācārya Priyavrata Śarmā regarded him as his Ādiguru (first teacher) and acquired the poetic skills from him. Married to ŚrImati Padmāvatī Śarmā in 1936 during his graduation study at Ayurvedic college of Kāśī Hindu Viśvavidyālaya. She continued to be his inspiration for more than 65 years till her last breath on 23rd December 2001. 3.5

Education

Ācārya Priyavrata Śarmā acquired primary education in Vēdaratna Vidyālaya, on the base of Gurukula Śailī (seminary style) in Mustafapur. He joined the Ayurvedic college of Kāśī Hindu Viśvavidyālaya and obtained A.M.S. degree in 1940.^{3,4,6} Even after obtaining degree, he relentlessly studied Āyurvēda along with Ayurvedic practice. He was influenced with the statement of Ācārya Suśruta "The physician should learn as many allied sciences as possible for the proper understanding of the Āyurvēda as it is not possible to comprehend all branches of science in one treatise" (Su. Sū. 4/7).

He studied different languages i.e. Sanskrit, Hindi, English and Bangla. He obtained M.A. Sanskrit from B.H.U. in 1948, *Sāhityācārya* from Bihar Sahitya Academy in 1949 and M.A. Hindi from Patna University in 1950.² He was also mastered in other subjects related to *Āyurvēda* i.e. *Vyākaraṇa* (grammar), *Sāhitya* (literature), *Darśana* (doctrines of Philosophy), *Ithihāsa* (history) etc. to obtain more proficiency in *Āyurvēda*.⁵

Academic and Administrative Contribution

 $\bar{A}c\bar{a}rya$ Priyavrata Śarmā has held highest positions in the academic as well as administrative spheres of $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$. He started his career as an Ayurvedic practitioner and then carried out many works i.e. teaching, administration, research in $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$, writing Ayurvedic books and editing of old Ayurvedic treatises etc. Even he standardized the teaching of Dravyaguṇa on scientific lines which is still being followed all over the country and abroad.

(1) As an Ayurvedic Physician

After completion of graduation (A.M.S.) in 1940 (from Kāśī Hindu Viśvavidyālaya) he practiced Āyurvēda at Khagol in Bihar for six years.

(2) As a Teacher and Administrator

He joined as a lecturer in Ayurvedic College, Begusarai in Bihar in 1946 and taught *Racanāśārīra* (Human anatomy) and *Kriyāśārīra* (Human physiology) (1946-53). Later he joined in *Kāśī Hindu Viśvavidyālaya* in 1953 as a lecturer in the department of *Dravyaguṇa* (1953-56). He came back to Bihar, worked as Principal in Govt. Ayurvedic College, Patna and developed it systematically (1956-60). In the year 1960 he became Deputy Director, Health Services (Indian Medicine) in Bihar (1960-63). After the establishment of P.G centre at B.H.U, he was appointed as Professor and Head of Department of *Dravyaguṇa* and Director of Post graduate Institute (1963-80). He than adorned the chair of Dean, Faculty of Indian Medicine in 1978 and in 1980 he retired from the service of B.H.U. Later on, he worked as a Professor and Director, Centre for History of Medicine, Asiatic Society, Calcutta (1985), as Principal Investigator for research projects under the Indian national Science Academy, New Delhi up to a decade and as *Guru* (Professor) under the *Rāṣṭrīya Āyurvēda Vidyāpiṭha* (National Academy of Ayurveda), New Delhi for two years.^{24,6}

With his proficiency in teaching and guidance he has guided 16 M.D. and 14 Ph.D. dissertations during his tenure at Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi.

(3) Literary Contributions

 $\bar{A}c\bar{a}rya$ Priyavrata Śarmā edited fourteen important manuscripts and three books, written thirty two books on different subjects of $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$ and three books on poetry in Hindi and Sanskrit languages. Thus he worked on about 52 books as an editor or as an author and published about 500 scientific papers.³

Conclusion

 $\bar{A}c\bar{a}rya$ Priyavrata Śarmā will be remembered by Ayurvedic fraternity as face of $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$ in the 20th century for the contributions he made to the science of $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$.

He made historic revolution in writing on Ayurvedic subjects; he wrote text books according to the Central Council of Indian Medicine (CCIM) syllabus of $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}d\bar{a}c\bar{a}rya$ (Graduate degree in $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$) and $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}dav\bar{a}caspati$ (Postgraduate degree in $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$). He followed the style which suits the current curriculum and other needs of scholars by incorporating relevant scientific and technological inputs viz. Pharmacognosy, Pharmacology and Phytochemistry along with $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$. These books are quite popular among generations of students and teachers of $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$. Another set of works by him in the form of Hindi and English translations of Ayurvedic treatises are quite lucid and handy for research scholars. He brought into light several Ayurvedic manuscripts by editing them.

He is a polymath whose erudition expands to various knowledge spheres like Sanskrit literature, History, Manuscriptology and $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$. His dedication, hard work, conceptual thinking, simplicity, dutifulness and discipline made him unique and incomparable. The legendary personality left this material world on 18th May, 2007. The Life history and contributions of $\bar{A}c\bar{a}rya$ Priyavrata Śarmā will be the source of inspiration and guiding light for the budding scientists of $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$ forever.

Ācārya Priyavrata Śarmā: Epitome of Āpta of present era

The $\bar{A}pt\bar{o}pad\bar{e}sa$ is one of the four means of getting true knowledge and $\bar{A}c\bar{a}rya$ Caraka has defined $\bar{A}pta$ as follows: The $\bar{A}pta$ (authorities) are the personalities who have freed themselves from passion (Rajas) and ignorance (Tamas) by means of spiritual endeavor and knowledge, whose understanding embracing the past, present and future ($Trik\bar{a}la$), is pure (Amala) and at all times, unclouded ($Avy\bar{a}hata$). It is these that are authoritative, the learned (Sista), the enlightened (Vibuddha) and their word is unimpeachable (Asamsaya) and true (Satya). $\bar{A}c\bar{a}rya$ Priyavrata $Sarm\bar{a}$ is one of such $\bar{A}pta$ or Authority in the present era who enlightened the community of $\bar{A}yurv\bar{e}da$ with his indispensable scientific, humanitarian and universal spirit.

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सारांश

आचार्य प्रियव्रत शर्मा की जीवनी एवं आयुर्वेद में उनका योगदान

आचार्य प्रियव्रत शर्मा आयुर्वेद के क्षेत्र में अपने अमूल्य योगदान के लिए प्रसिद्ध है। वह एक महान् लेखक, वक्ता, अध्यापक, अनुसन्धाता, मार्गदर्शक एवं इन सबसे ऊपर एक उत्तम मनुष्य के रूप में तथा २०वीं सदी में आयुर्वेद के प्रतीक के रूप में रहे हैं।

दिनांक १ नवम्बर १९२० को बिहार राज्य के पटना जिले में खगोल के पास मुस्तफापुर नामक एक छोटे से ग्राम में एक पारम्परिक वैद्य परिवार में उनका जन्म हुआ। उनके पिताजी पण्डित रामावतार मिश्र वैद्यभूषण एवं माताजी श्रीमित प्रेमदुलारी थे। वह आयुर्वेद के साथ-साथ संस्कृत एवं हिन्दी में निष्णात थे। आयुर्वेद में शैक्षणिक और प्रशासनिक क्षेत्रों में वह उच्चतम पदों पर आसीन हुए।

आचार्य प्रियव्रत शर्मा ने लगभग ३५ पुस्तकों के लेखन, १४ पाण्डुलिपियों और ३ पुस्तकों के सम्पादन का कार्य करने के साथ-साथ लगभग ५०० लेख लिखने का कार्य भी किया। उन्होंने अनेक राष्ट्रीय एवं अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय सम्भाषापरिषदों में भाग लिया तथा वह राष्ट्रीय स्तर पर अनेक आयुर्वेद समितियों से सम्बद्ध रहे। अतः इस लेख में गहरी श्रद्धा के साथ आचार्य प्रियव्रत शर्मा की जीवनी सम्बन्धी जानकारी एवं आयुर्वेद में उनके योगदान को प्रस्तुत किया जा रहा है।
